6	WEBER: Certainly. First, I'll call the roll

9 CHAI RMAN FUNDERBURG: Here.

10 WEBER: Gila Bronner?

11 BRONNER: Here.

12 CHAIRMAN FUNDERBURG: And I'll call those

13 attending by audio conference. Lerry Knox?

14 KNOX: Here.

15 WEBER: Eric Anderberg? Robert Horne? Please 16 note that the last two are absent. On the question 17 of a quorum of those members physically present, and 18 present by audio conference, I declare a quorum has 19 been constituted.

20 CHAIRMAN FUNDERBURG: Okay, thank you. Do any 21 of the Members of the Board wish to direct General 22 Counsel Weber to make any edits of the minutes of 23 the Special Meeting of the Committee held on March 24 10th, 2016?

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1 BRONNER: No.

2 CHAI RMAN FUNDERBURG: Lerry?

3 KNOX: No.

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4 CHAIRMAN FUNDERBURG: Okay. So is there a

5 motion pending, then, to approve the minutes?

6 BRONNER: So moved.

7 KNOX: Second.

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8 CHAIRMAN FUNDERBURG: Both open and closed 9 session. We have a motion. We have a second. All 10 in favor, please say aye.

If a need for confidentiality WEBER: 20 exists as to all or part of the closed session 21 minutes, then those closed session minutes can 22 remain closed until the next periodic review required by the Open Meetings Act, and I have put 23 24 together a list of portions of the closed session MARZULLO REPORTING AGENCY (312) 321-9365

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1 minutes that I am suggesting remain closed. 2 I have given -- I'm sorry, Lerry, I don't 3 have these for you via audio conference, but for 4 those people here, I've highlighted the sections 5 here which if you turn pages, you will see what is 6 in yellow. Chris, do you have one? 7 MEISTER: I'm deferring to you. WEBER: Just for people to follow along. 8 What 9 I am recommending is that all of the closed sessions 10 minutes be open to the public except for page 3 11 lines 23 and 24. Page 4, lines 1 through 5. Page 12 4, line 8 starting with the word "including" through the word "potential" on line 19. 13 14 Page 6, line 15, starting with the word 15 "and" and continuing through the end of the 16 And page 9, line 3 through line 20. sentence. And Page 4

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17 for clarity, what I just read, those would remain 18 cl osed. 19 CHAIRMAN FUNDERBURG: 0kay. Thank you. ls 20 there such a motion suggested by General Counsel 21 Weber? 22 BRONNER: Yes. So moved. 23 CHAIRMAN FUNDERBURG: Is there a second? 24 KNOX: Second. MARZULLO REPORTING AGENCY (312) 321-9365

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1 CHAIRMAN FUNDERBURG: All in favor, please say 2 aye. (A chorus of ayes.) 3 4 CHAI RMAN FUNDERBURG: Any opposed? (No response.) 5 6 CHAIRMAN FUNDERBURG: Okay. At this point, I 7 would like to turn over the meeting to Executive 8 Director Meister. 9 MEISTER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I asked 10 Chairman Funderburg to have this meeting for a couple of reasons. Number one, when the Chairman 11 12 was first appointed, I think one of the very first 13 things that we discussed was opportunities for 14 growth; and now just over a year later, I think that 15 we do have some opportunities. But in that context, I wanted to revisit 16 17 with the Executive Session, recognizing that the --18 or the Executive Committee, recognizing that 19 ultimately hiring, compensation, and other staff 20 performance issues are actually covered by the Page 5

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Open Session 5-11-16 (Version 2).txt Governance and Personnel meeting; but I did want to revisit this, because I think that we are at a great opportunity. I did want to just remind everybody back MARZULLO REPORTING AGENCY (312) 321-9365

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1 in 2011, we did put together a strategic plan, 2 copies of which are available and published on the 3 website for everyone's convenience, but the most 4 important part, and this is both on the agenda and 5 in the folders, are that when we discussed new business lines, new pursuits, new missions, that we 6 7 have core criteria, which I believe are very 8 valuable, for the Board's consideration, public 9 mission, risk profile, net revenue impact and 10 competitive position, the last being basically as a 11 small public agency. 12 We don't want to get into a position where 13 we are competing with either larger government, 14 nonprofit or for-profit organizations. Soin 15 keeping these contexts in mind, one of the things 16 that I have been giving a great deal of thought, and 17 doing some work over the past several months, is I 18 believe that we have two possible future areas of 19 growth, recognizing that our core business is the 20 issuance of federally tax-exempt conduit bonds on behalf of not-for-profits or certain categories of 21 22 for-profit or individual. 23 And those two categories are local 24 government lending, and what has been broadly

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1 defined sometimes as public/private partnership, 2 sometimes as alternative finance and procurement. From time to time, we've discussed other 3 pursuits. I think I would suggest to the Executive 4 5 Committee that we focus on these two for the 6 present. And as we consider hiring and developing a 7 hiring plan, as well as a longer-term plan for 8 compensation, talent attraction, talent retention, 9 growth and development of the current team and the 10 current staff, that we do have some well-known areas 11 that we've discussed at other meetings - procurement, 12 compliance, accounting, administrative support. 13 But I think that the opportunity is not 14 only that we can remain focused on our core business 15 of conduit, and yet deliberately, considerately, 16 thoughtfully approach these two areas, because I 17 believe that we can hire for these two larger areas, 18 not just for our current needs, but with a view 19 towards growth, and at the same time we will need 20 different types of people for these new endeavors. 21 For example, if we went into local 22 government, direct local government lending in a 23 larger manner than we currently do, currently it's 24 an adjunct to the business and industry group, we're MARZULLO REPORTING AGENCY (312) 321-9365

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1 going to need basically people that originate loans.

2 We're going to need people that manage loans. We're

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Open Session 5-11-16 (Version 2).txt 3 going to need more of them. We're going to need 4 possibly additional legal help with standardizing 5 documents.

6 Also, the other option is or the other 7 suggestion is alternative financing, procurement, or 8 public/private partnerships which, in essence, is 9 procurement, plus contract administration, and those 10 are different skills than the current team.

And, in addition, those are -- I would not want to distract the current team from their core conduit mission because their core conduit mission currently is our primary mission and is our primary stream of revenue. So that was the broad overview. I'll take any questions.

17 CHAIRMAN FUNDERBURG: Any questions at all? BRONNER: Well, one question would be within 18 19 the local government lending arena, are you thinking 20 specifically about general versus special purpose 21 governments or a particular stream? So when we look 22 at special districts, you might have Housing 23 Authority, school districts, transit authorities, a 24 whole litany, water and sewer, utilities, that would MARZULLO REPORTING AGENCY (312) 321-9365

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1 fall in special district versus general purpose. So 2 it's just a --3 MEISTER: I would suggest that I think our best 4 approach is the water and sewer space. The 5 predecessor entity, the rural bond bank, while it facilitated to be a large array of local 6 7 governments, I think the strongest loans within that Page 8

Open Session 5-11-16 (Version 2).txt 8 portfolio are water and sewer. 9 We've also had some experience back in 10 2013 with the State Revolving Fund, and we are also 11 currently, pursuant to statutory mission, giving 12 basically low- or no-interest loans through a State government revenue stream for fire trucks and 13 14 ambulances, but I would suggest that we focus on 15 sewer and water. 16 BRONNER: Sewer and water, okay. 17 MEISTER: Yes. And that would also lend itself 18 to if we are looking to grow, our challenges can be 19 not reinventing the wheel with every transaction that we would have form documents and form term 20 21 sheets, form resolutions, form resolutions for the 22 local government, or resolutions or ordinances. 23 That would be my suggested thoughts. 24 BRONNER: And so it would be principally for

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1 local government lending where they aren't issuing 2 their own debt, and they're not -- are we looking at 3 -- I'm trying to understand sort of the size entity 4 and the type of entity, and are we limiting it to 5 Illinois, or are we thinking more broadly? 6 MEISTER: I believe that we are limiting it to 7 Illinois. Initially, what I would hope to do is 8 think about using some of our balance sheet. 9 In the event that there might be 10 ultimately an end to the budget discussions, possibly since we're already thinking in this 11

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Open Session 5-11-16 (Version 2).txt direction, we could say the Board Leadership has 12 already thought about this, if there is an 13 14 opportunity for an appropriation or for programs 15 that may exist elsewhere in State Government, but I 16 think that is --17 BRONNER: There's market opportunity. 18 WEBER: Yes. 19 BRONNER: Okay. 20 WEBER: Yes. 21 CHAI RMAN FUNDERBURG: Okay. Thank you. Any 22 other questions at all? Okay. If not, then I would 23 like to suggest that we consider going to closed 24 session. Ms. Weber? MARZULLO REPORTING AGENCY (312) 321-9365 1 WEBER: Yes.
