24	MR. FRAMPTON: This is Rich Frampton.

Thank you, Committee Chair Wright. Business Item 1 1 2 is a request for a Final Bond Resolution by 3 Benedictine University, hereinafter "Benedictine," or the "University," in an amount not-to-exceed 4 \$27,500,000. The Series 2021 Bonds will be used to 5 currently refund 100 percent of the outstanding 6 7 balance of the University's IFA Series 2013 A Bonds. The 2021 Refunding Bonds will be a general 8 9 obligation of the University.

First off, I have a ratings update. On Friday, January 8, S&P Global Ratings assigned a BBB rating with negative outlook on the Series 2021 Refunding Bounds. At the same time, S&P also affirmed the same BBB rating and negative outlook on the University's outstanding IFA Series 2017 Bonds. Notably, the University has maintained this BBB long-term rating since the original Series 2013 A Bond rating was assigned back in October of 2013. Given the ongoing enrollment challenges common to the higher education sector, the fact that Benedictine has maintained its BBB long-term debt rating after nine consecutive years of enrollment declines is a major accomplishment and is indicative of S&P's confidence in the University's stewardship.

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Certainly, Benedictine is highly reliant on student -- on tuition and student housing related revenues, which the other generated approximately 93 percent of the total revenues over the past three years.

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maintained its BBB rating by diligently managing expenses. One example, Benedictine has materially reduced both faculty and administration head count over the past two years as enrollment has declined. Although fall 2020 enrollment declined yet again, there is one bright spot. Benedictine's new incoming freshman head count increased from 228 to 298, a 30 percent increase compared to fall 2019. This followed after the University reorganized its recruitment team and strategy, thereby, improving the percentage of accepted students who enroll.

In another recent positive development, Benedictine negotiated a new line of credit agreement with Wintrust Bank in April.

Despite pandemic related revenue and expense challenges, Benedictine has continued to fund operations entirely from cash flows without undertaking any draws from this Wintrust line.

So what will the Refunding Bond issue do to benefit Benedictine? In particular, the Series 2021 Refunding Bonds will have three key impacts on Benedictine's future operating results.

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First: Refunding Bonds will provide an initial three-year principal moratorium until October 1st of 2024. This will help the University conserve cash while riding out the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Secondly, the Series 2021 Bond amortization schedule will extend the final maturity date by five years compared to the 2013 Bonds. The new final maturity date will be October 1, 2038, which will match up with the existing final maturity date on the 2017 Bonds.

Thirdly, the series 2021 Bonds will create level future debt service payments on both series of Bonds through the October 2038 final maturity date.

Finally, the future combined level debt service payments will actually be \$60,000 less than what the University paid in Fiscal 2020.

So, the refunding Bonds will provide for future payments that the University has already

1 | successfully serviced.

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Moving on to the conclusions, these results suggest the University is pursuing a conservative plan of refinancing.

Secondly, Benedictine's pro forma debt service coverage at 1.84 times indicates the University will be able to sustain additional future enrollment declines without impairing its ability to cover future scheduled payments.

Thirdly, these conclusions further -- are further supported by S&P's rating action on Friday, which affirmed the BBB rating with negative outlook on the University's Series 2017 Bonds.

And finally, the proposed issuance of the Series 2021 Bonds is significantly positive for Benedictine. It will enable the University to conserve cash to fund operations while the University proceeds to deleverage its balance sheet over time.
