Ryan AbilityLab, who is the Borrower.

Bond proceeds will be used to refund all or a portion of the outstanding Series 2013A Bonds, previously issued by the Authority on behalf of the Borrower, to fund interest on the bonds, if deemed necessary or advisable by the Authority and/or the Borrower, and to pay cost of issuance.

This is a Final Bond Resolution, one-time consideration, and it's the first time this project is being presented to the Members.

Under Borrower description, there are

details about the Shirley Ryan AbilityLab. The
Borrower currently employs 2,200 people at its new
building which was completed in 2017 and was
financed with the proceeds of the Series 2013 Bonds.

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- Shirley Ryan AbilityLab has several accolades, including the distinction of being the No. 1 ranked provider of comprehensive physical medicine and rehabilitation care in the nation for 31 years by U.S. News and World Report.
- The Bonds will be secured by an obligation of the Borrower, including a pledge of unrestricted receivables under the Master Trust Indenture.
- Under Structure and Credit

 Indicators, the Bonds will be a bank direct purchase
 by Morgan Stanley Bank N.A.
- The Borrower and the financing team anticipate that the Bonds will be issued on a forward basis. The Forward Bond Purchase Agreement that is expected to be executed this week will provide for the interest rate on the bonds.
- The Bonds are anticipated to be issued and funded on April 3, 2023, or within 90 days thereafter.

The Bonds will not be funded at any event no more than 90 days prior to July 1st, 2023, the call date on the bonds.

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This forward purchase structure is being utilized because while the Borrower would like to take advantage of the current low interest rates, the Bonds are not currently refundable and the Tax Code no longer allows for advanced refunding. So this structure, in essence, creates a synthetic advanced refunding and has been utilized in prior financings that the Members have seen such as the University of Chicago Medical Center.

The bonds will be rated A stable outlook by Fitch. This is an upgrade from the previous A- that Fitch had prior rated the underlying rating. Fitch has also upgraded the underlying rating to A stable outlook effective December 9, 2021.

Following the rating information are the Estimated Sources and Uses.

If you turn to page 7 of the PDF, under Financing Summary and Structure, you can see the new interest rate is estimated not-to-exceed 5 percent; and as of November 29, 2021, is estimated

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The contemplated financing will fund installation of a new solar system for a commercial property with an estimated cost of more than \$2 million.

Hearing none, next is Tab 4 in your Board Books, which is a Resolution on behalf of the Chicago Academy of Sciences, more commonly known as Peggy Notebaert Nature Museum, regarding its outstanding tax-exempt bond issued by the Authority in 2013.

As a 501(c)(3) entity, the Nature Museum issued its tax-exempt bonds to the Authority in 2013 in order to refinance approximately five and a half million dollars of its outstanding indebtedness first incurred in 1998.

The Authority's Series 2013 Bond was

purchased by PNC Bank and PNC Bank continues to hold the Series 2013 Bond to this day.

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The variable rate bond has a final maturity date of January 1st, 2033, with mandatory sinking fund redemption payments scheduled to begin on June 1st, 2023, pursuant to a First Amendment of the Bond and related bond documents that were consented to by the Authority in 2019. Even so, as the Nature Museum has already paid down approximately \$1 million of principal, PNC Bank agreed pursuant to the First Amendment in 2019 to hold the Series 2013 Bonds until December 31, 2021, which is the end of this month.

Accordingly, at this time, the Authority is being asked to provide its consent to extend the banking term with PNC Bank an additional five years to December 31, 2026, increase the effective interest rate borne on the Series 2013 Bond by approximately 25 basis points, and revise the schedule and amounts of mandatory sinking fund redemption payments otherwise required during the banking term by approximately \$732,000 less than the aggregate. Additionally, the variable rate borne on the Series 2013 Bond will now be based on the

- Bloomberg Short-Term Bank Yield Index, or the BSBY rate, administered by Bloomberg Index Services

 Limited.
 - The BSBY rate will replace the LIBOR rate in calculating the effective variable rate under the Bond documents. Interest payments will remain quarterly.
 - Greenberg Traurig has been engaged by the Authority to review this second amendment and Ice Miller as bond counsel will be delivering a no adverse effect opinion acceptable to the Authority.
 - Our amendment fee for this transaction is listed on top of page 4 of the report in the Confidential section and the Peer Review Committee recommends approval.

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Item 5 regards the Authority's

calendar year 2022 Volume Cap request. Item 5 is a

Resolution of Intent that will be delivered together

with the Authority's calendar year 2022 Volume Cap request letter to the Governor's Office of Management and Budget, or GOMB, on Monday January 3, 2022.

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GOMB requests that the governing board of each state agency that issues Volume Cap Private Activity Bonds file a Resolution of Intent as a supplemental exhibit to its annual Volume Cap allocation request letter.

As in 2021, the Authority is again requesting \$120 million from the available State Agency Volume Cap Pool for use by prospective calendar year 2022 Beginning Farmer Bond and Industrial Revenue Bond financings.

The primary users of the State Agency
Volume Cap Pool include the Authority and the
Illinois Housing Development Authority.

So what is volume cap? Volume Cap was a concept added to the Internal Revenue Code in the Deficit Reduction Act of 1984 or the Federal Act to impose an annual dollar issuance limit for tax-exempt private activity bonds issued for new money projects undertaken by for-profit tax-paying corporations and individuals.

The Authority's most frequent volume cap borrowers include eligible first-time farmers, small manufacturing projects, and solid waste disposal projects.

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Prior to the beginning of each calendar year, the Internal Revenue Service publishes guidance regarding the amount of volume cap that will be available for all issuers of private activity bond -- Volume Cap Private Activity Bonds, including home rule units, non-home rule units, and state agencies in each state with the aggregate amount available to the state as a whole referred to as the state ceiling.

In calendar years 2021 and 2022, the state ceiling for all states was set at \$110 per capita.

Based on the State of Illinois' U.S. census population estimate of approximately
12.5 million applicable in calendar year 2021,
Illinois' calendar year 2021 state ceiling totaled
\$1.38 billion.

The Federal Act further specifies through provisions that are applicable solely to the State of Illinois that of Illinois' approximate \$1.3

- 15 memo on page 1, I note three recent developments
- 16 resulting from the Infrastructure and Investment --
- 17 | the Infrastructure, Investment, and Jobs Act, or
- 18 | IIJA, which was signed into law in November.
- 19 Specifically, the IIJA specifies
- 20 | new -- two new categories of Volume Cap Private
- 21 Activity Bonds, including Qualified Broadband
- 22 | Project Bonds and, secondly, Qualified Carbon
- 23 Reduction Facility Bonds. We will be waiting for
- 24 | the IRS to release technical guidance on these

provisions over the next 16 to 18 months before we'll realistically be able to assess impact on demand.

Finally, the IIJA also reauthorized the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway and Surface Transportation Private Activity Bond program by increasing the national bond issuance limit allocated by the U.S. Secretary of Transportation from \$15 billion to \$30 billion.

As noted in several prior IFA Board meetings, the Authority issued \$605 million of these U.S. DOT allocated bonds between 2020 and 2022, which financed several phases of development and build-out at CenterPoint Properties Joliet Intermodal Center Facility. So we have had significant successful experience deploying this U.S. DOT product.

Finally, wrapping things up, staff recommends approval of the accompanying Resolution of Intent for 2022 Volume Cap. The Resolution is straightforward and consistent with past practice.
